Purpose/Principle/Definitions:

No person on College property will:

- 1. Injure or threaten to injure another;
- 2. Damage the property of another or of the College;
- 3. Violate parking regulations;
- 4. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner;
- 5. Impede, delay, or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the College's educational program or any other activity taking place on College property that has been authorized by the Board, President, or other authorized administrator;
- 6. Enter any portion of College premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by College officials;
- 7. Weapons or firearms are prohibited on campus unless the owner possesses a current Oregon state concealed-handgun license;
- 8. Possess, consume, sell, give, or deliver unlawful drugs or drug paraphernalia;

- Consume, sell, give, or deliver alcoholic beverages as prohibited by Board policy unless as otherwise approved by the College in certain circumstances and in advance as provided by law;
- 10. Violate the College's policy on use of tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems;
- 11. Wear, possess, use, distribute, display, or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign, or other items that are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang; or use speech or commit any act or omission in furtherance of the interests of any gang or gang activity. (A "gang" is defined as a group that identifies itself through the use of a name, unique appearance, or language including hand signs; claiming of geographical territory, or the espousing of a distinctive belief system that frequently results in criminal activity.);
- 12. Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the Board and/or promulgated by the President designed to maintain public order on College property.

Persons having no legitimate purpose or business on College property or violating or threatening to violate the above rules may be ejected from the premises and/or referred to law enforcement officials.
